TAKE FIVE - EDITION II (2006) A Jerwood Charity/PRS Foundation Initiative

Following a hugely successful pilot, The Jerwood Charity and the PRS Foundation for new music (PRSF) are pleased to announce that international music producers Serious will produce **Take Five** - a significant artist development scheme for emerging jazz musicians.

The **Jerwood/PRS Foundation 'Take Five' Initiative** is designed to give some of the UK's most talented young jazz musicians the unique opportunity to take 'time out' to develop their craft. The scheme provides each artist with the special opportunity to discuss, explore and strengthen all aspects of their future careers. The eight British jazz musicians selected this year are:

- Julia Biel (vocalist/London)
- Mara Carlyle (vocalist/London)
- Aref Durvesh (tabla/London)
- Soweto Kinch (alto saxophone/Birmingham)
- David Okumu (guitar/London)
- Gwilym Simcock (pianist/London)
- Dave Stapleton (piano/Cardiff)
- Neil Yates (trumpet/Manchester)

The **Jerwood/PRS Foundation 'Take Five' Initiative** will run from November 2005 to May 2006 and comprises a number of sessions under the collective areas of:

- Talk Time
- Learning Time
- Focus Time
- Time-out
- Creative Time

Each artist will benefit from one-to-one sessions to identify their particular areas of interest and needs, as well as two residential periods exploring areas such as composition, studio technology, live producing and strategic direction. Take Five will also give participants access to mentoring and an opportunity to engage with those working in other art forms.

The Jerwood Charity, PRS Foundation and Serious share the strong belief that investment in creative development is of paramount importance to artists reaching their full potential. In the UK there exists a community of exceptionally talented young jazz musicians and it is vital that they are fully aware of the abundance of opportunities available to them. The **Jerwood/PRS Foundation 'Take Five' Initiative** aims to both stimulate creativity and raise aspirations by facilitating opportunities for artists to engage with their peers and to be challenged by the practices of others.

A panel of industry experts contributed to the selection process, taking into account the following considerations for each participant: creativity, future potential, style of music, range of influences, geography, cultural background and distinctive contribution to the community. The panel included representatives from Jerwood Charity, PRS Foundation and Serious, as well as David Francis (CMN, London), Debra King (FKuk, Manchester), and Jason Yarde (freelance musician, composer and producer, London).
